We'll also do age-appropriate science activities to lay the foundation for early scientific inquiry skills which encourage children to ask questions, make observations and predictions.

This month we will learn about our five senses with fun-filled science activities that engage all our senses and extend our newly developed scientific inquiry skills. The last week of February is Dr. Seuss Week which will be a fun week with tonguetwisting literacy. We will be planting seeds for the early stages of learning to read with "phonemic awareness"—this means that children become aware that speech is made up of individual sounds, and with the "prealphabetic phase" where children recognize and remember words by their shapes.

We look forward to an amazing 2018—success is the sum of small efforts repeated...day in and day out. Happy new year!
